Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012



- Act implements key Administration priorities
 - Public Law No. 112-96 (enacted February 22, 2012)
- NTIA to establish the First Responder Network Authority (FirstNet)

Purpose	To create a nationwide, wireless, interoperable public safety broadband network
Network	Single nationwide network architecture
Technology	LTE: the most advanced, proven technology
Spectrum	Reallocated 700 MHz D Block
Coverage	Nationwide along with rural, underserved areas
Funding	\$7B through spectrum auctions proceeds
Sustainability	Self-funded through fees
Governance	Specifications for the FirstNet Board

Public Safety Needs FirstNet




Police officers, firefighters and paramedics need a dedicated nationwide wireless broadband network. They need a network that they can count on during emergencies and to meet their everyday missions.

Complementing LMR with LTE



Public safety will rely on land mobile radio (LMR) for mission-critical voice until LTE capabilities exceed current functionality

- Push-to-talk
- Direct mode
- Emergency calling
- Enhanced broadcast
- High-power mobile
- Public safety-grade performance



- Complete an open, transparent, and competitive process for network equipment and services proposals based on detailed technical requirements, resulting in multiple awards that could supplement or substitute for all or part of a comprehensive network proposal

 - Serve users



Defining the Consultation Process





Initial Consultation Agenda Topics



Topic	Description
State or Territory Update	Discuss any topics the state or territory feels necessary to facilitate consultation process.
FirstNet Update	Provide update on FirstNet activities related to technical design, organization, outreach and overall policy.
Consultation Process	Delineate the consultation process, with a timeframe, key steps and strategy.
Roles and Responsibilities	Discuss responsibilities and roles for FirstNet, state officials and major stakeholders.
Eligible Users	Review baseline information about potential users in each state.
Coverage	Provide definition of coverage. Guide conversation to help states begin to think about coverage needs.
Joint Outreach Planning	Identify how FirstNet can best support outreach efforts in the state or territory based on a review of material provided in the Readiness Checklist.
Next Steps	Discuss joint outreach activities, completion of the user baseline, and any additional next steps identified in the meeting.
