Executive Report - Bill Webb

- Congratulations to Steve and Tony
- Remembrance of Lou Amabili
 - Selected by President Nixon to serve on the National Commission on Fire Prevention and Control
 - Formed the Delaware State Fire School and served as Director from 1964 to 1996
 - Served on the CFSI Board of Directors since 1994

2017 Year in Review

- Advocacy
 - Work up on Capitol Hill on the AFG/SAFER reauthorization and other and legislation
 - Fire Caucus leadership working to recruit new members
 - Congressional Ride Along Program for staff -- had a great response from the participants. Thank you to Chief Dean and DC Fire and EMS for helping make this program possible
 - BuildStrong coalition participated in a forum with them on June 7th
 - CFSI Whitepaper: Convened a panel chaired by Denny Compton to develop the paper.
 Denny will discuss the paper later in the meeting
- Education and outreach
 - Been busy traveling and conducting presentations at conferences and tradeshows
 - o Involved in the Fire Service Occupational Cancer Symposium

- Tributes and recognition
 - In October, CFSI and NFFF conducted the annual Congressional Flag Presentation Ceremony on Capitol Hill
 - o CFSI/Masimo Fire Service-Based EMS Awards will open soon
 - Nominations are now open for the Dr. Anne Phillips Award for Leadership in Fire Safety Education
 - Senator John McCain is the recipient of the 2018 CFSI Legislator of the Year Award

Communications

- The website has gone through changes and has a whole new look
- o Email updates have new design, including a Corporate Spotlight feature
- Corporate Partners program
 - Making changes to the program to enhance the benefits CFSI can offer to everyone
- Fundraising programs
 - o Selling White House Christmas ornaments this year, and have the Silent Auction
 - Fundraising is 87% dependent on the dinner
- Dinner theme is "Engaging Future Leaders"
 - Need to look toward the next generation of people and how to get them involved.
 - Tony Jackson is performing at the dinner
 - Award presentations include videos
 - o Bistro Bash the night before the dinner that will include the silent auction.
 - Looking to develop a new seminar program for future leaders
 - Like to recognize Sean, Shannon, Dave, Ken, and Lee for extraordinary work on AFG and SAFER reauthorization

Development Report - Steven Tramel

- CFSI opened registration for the dinner
- Working on a new project for a 2018 Christmas ornament that pays tribute to the fire service
 - Designs can be submitted by anyone through a design competition currently being conducted
 - The winner will be selected by a panel of judges.
 - Will order 2500 ornaments and will offer bulk pricing at \$20, \$18, \$16
 - Any organization, whether local or national, can resell these ornaments as fundraisers
 - Sponsorship of the program is available at \$25,000
- Question Steve Edwards: Can these be sold on Amazon or eBay?
 - Steven: Yes, CFSI has an account on eBay for Charities and we can sell through there, our website and on Amazon as well.

Programmatic and Legislative Report - Sean Carroll

- Had a survey to see what we can improve on the upcoming symposium
- We did another open call for proposals for the seminars program
 - For the 2018 program we will have 10 seminars available for CEUs, as well as the Opening Session and Town Hall Meeting
- Seeing membership of the Fire Caucus decline over the years

- Beginning of the year, we had 201 members on the fire caucus; now we have 238 members
- AFG/SAFER reauthorization was approved by the Senate by unanimous consent
 - Still working to pass in the House
 - Have a very short amount of time to get it approved
 - Talk to your member of Congress to make it clear that we need this approved by the end of the year
- Question- Denny Compton: Has there been any discussion about what course of action we might take in the future with regards to this in the House?

Sean: Yes, but first we need to reauthorize the program and after that occurs that would be a great discussion to have.

- Tax legislation moving through Congress. Senate and House have passed differing tax bills
 - o Senate-passed version includes provisions from the Fire Sprinkler Incentive Act
 - Senators Collins and Carper are working hard to get these provisions included in the final tax bill
 - o On September 12th the House unanimously approved the Firefighter Cancer Registry Act

Lori Moore - The Opioid Crisis

- Addictions largely involve individuals who get opioids through doctor's prescription for pain management
 - Doctors due a poor job monitoring prescriptions
- IAFF working with DEA to get more information to understand epidemic
- 144 people die every day from opioid overdoses
- Fentanyl is an analog of drugs like heroin
- Legal drug used for surgeries and prescription drugs
 - One of the leading causes of opioid deaths in the US
 - o A deadly dose of fentanyl is equal to 1/1000th the amount of sugar in a sugar packet
 - Carfentanyl is used in veterinary medicine
 - o 10,000 times more potent
 - o Can be absorbed through the skin
 - Hand sanitizer should not be used if you have carfentanyl on your skin
- DEA has released a first responders guide for fentanyl response
- Naloxone (Narcan) is the lone drug that will reverse the effects of an overdose from fentanyl
 - Boston firefighters began carrying Narcan on every fire apparatus beginning in 2014
 - Boston Fire has saved 1,500 lives administering Narcan (Naloxone) in 2015/2016
 - o As of April 2017, 59% increase in overdoses in the city of Boston.
 - In 2016, over half of the overdoses occurred in homes.
- Boston Fire has introduced Knock and Talk Program to provide education, information, and resources to individuals that have experienced an overdose.
 - o 73% of participants that are home are willing to talk to Boston Fire
- Boston Fire has helped patients get beds in recovery homes
- IAFF working with IAFC and Metro Chiefs on safety recommendations
- Three arenas where the fire service can engage -
 - Administer naloxone (everyone should carry Narcan on apparatus)

- Scene safety (work with law enforcement)
- o Public education resources
- All states allow paramedics to administer naloxone.
 - o Around 20 states will not allow an EMT to use Narcan on overdosed people
- Education programs and toolkits are available through the IAFF
